The San Francisco Green Schoolyard Alliance is proud to announce the 2004 Green School Grounds Conference, to be held on Friday, October 8 (evening) and Saturday, October 9 (all day), 2004. We invite you to join us for an exciting line-up of presentations and workshops. Come get your hands dirty while you learn how to change your community's schoolyard into a living outdoor classroom.

Ecological schoolyards are being constructed all over the world. These cost-effective outdoor classrooms give schools essential hands-on

learning resources while beautifying their surroundings. They allow teachers to take their students on "field trips" without ever leaving school grounds. By creating green schoolyards, students, teachers, parents, and community members gain an intimate understanding of the environment and create a place for experiential learning.

The 2004 Green School Grounds Conference features hands-on workshops where you can learn how to use the sun as a teaching resource, plant a bird and butterfly garden, build a living willow play sculpture, and cover plain concrete with vibrant mosaics. In addition, many of the workshops will help you connect these activities to California's K-12 curricula.

Some of the workshops are designed to enhance the grounds of the schools that host them by creating ecological schoolyard amenities that will remain at the school site after the conference is over. Other workshops will address various aspects of creating, maintaining and using green schoolyards as teaching tools. Many workshops will connect different aspects of California curriculum requirements to the creation and stewardship of outdoor learning environments.

SFGSA 2004 GREEN SCHOOL GROUNDS CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2004

Each conference participant will be able to enroll in two workshops: one in the morning and one in the afternoon. We recommend that you select two workshops at the same school in order to minimize your travel. Some workshops will be offered all day, with morning and afternoon sessions available independently. In most of the all day workshops, the morning group will begin a project and the afternoon session will complete it. Space in each workshop is limited.

A) Bamboo Shade Structure

Learn about bamboo construction techniques while helping to build a small shade structure out of this renewable resource. – **AM & PM**

B) Cob Oven Sculpture

Come get your hands (and feet!) dirty helping to build an earth-based oven sculpture out of cob, a mixture of sand, clay, and straw. This workshop will cover project design, construction techniques, and cooking tips. – **AM & PM**
